

CRDF GLOBAL REQUEST FOR QUOTES

RFQ SME for SDPU Cancer Care Programming Deadline: 17:00 EST December 9th, 2024

Summary:

CRDF Global is seeking a subject matter expert (SME) to support upcoming cancer care programming in 2025 under the <u>Sustained Dialogue on Peaceful Uses (SDPU)</u>. As a part of the SDPU, CRDF Global will be hosting a series of large regional workshops and expert sessions on the margins of large international conferences in addition to managing various projects in line with the SDPU's mission focused on improving access to nuclear and radiation medicine. All programming under the SDPU is in line with the initiative's mission to expand access to and awareness of peaceful applications of nuclear science and technology as a sustainable development tool, in this case, particularly highlighting medical imaging for diagnosis and staging, radiation therapy for treatment, and nuclear medicine. Additionally, all programming will relate back to United Nations Sustainable Development Goal (UN SDG) 3 (Good Health and Well-being).

Scope:

The Contractor will support CRDF Global in the development and delivery of the SDPU healthcare programming including, but not limited to large regional workshops, expert sessions on the margins of large international conferences, and advisory support for projects funded by the SDPU in line with the initiative's mission to improve access to nuclear and radiation medicine. The main objective of these activities is to support increased access to and awareness of nuclear science and technology's role in development, particularly in the areas of radiation therapy, nuclear medicine, or medical imaging and diagnosis. The Contractor will deploy one (1) SME to travel to such activities. The work will consist of a series of ad hoc planning calls for the conceptualization, scheduling, and technical discussions that result in finalized engagement agendas for events such as large regional workshops or expert sessions on the margins of large international conferences. Additionally, the work will consist of a series of ad hoc planning meetings and advisory responsibilities to support the development, and implementation of projects funded by the SDPU that support increased access to radiation medicine. Contractor will contribute to the discussions, highlight concerns where relevant, review all engagement materials, and take lead on creating agendas when requested. Other tasks may include support of the materials development, participant outreach assistance, assign activity moderation and implementation, fostering participant engagement. The contractor will play an active role in activity closeout, as well as in internal and external reporting, CRDF Global will facilitate all travel, and logistics needed for in-person deployment of the SME.

The Contractor will perform all tasks and provide all deliverables from a perspective relevant to the activities' audience.

Task 1: Agenda Development and Outreach

The Contractor, as part of their contributions to the SDPU, will participate in a series of ad hoc planning calls with CRDF Global and other stakeholders to conceptualize, schedule, and technically develop an agenda for this Scope of Work. This will also allow for discussions regarding programmatic updates, recent conversations with Funder, and to accommodate any shifts in project implementation details. This task will continue until the materials are finalized in advance of the inperson, three-day workshop. The finalized agenda should be adapted to be appropriate for the target audience across Africa and is due to CRDF Global no later than ten (10) business days prior to the start of the workshop to allow for Funder approval.

With guidance from CRDF Global pertaining to selection priorities, the Contractor will utilize targeted invites and emails to leverage their networks in the region and based on their expertise. Through coordination calls, emails and other communication mediums, the Contractor will provide CRDF Global with direct linkages to their relevant networks and the opportunity to integrate this network into the potential workshop audience. Once the audience has been identified, CRDF Global will handle communications to registered participants, including session reminders, the distribution of materials following the event, and the event landing page on the program website.



Task 1 Deliverable(s):

- Finalized agenda for the workshop (1)
- Provide relevant stakeholders within the Contractor's network to CRDF Global

Task 2: Workshop Facilitation

The Contractor will deploy one (1) SME who will travel to and moderate the workshop being held in Rabat, Morocco, tentatively January 2024. The Contractor will serve as facilitator for the workshop and moderate sessions within the program focused on topics designed by both the Contractor and CRDF Global.

The Contractor may also be required to present materials for a session delivered by the Contractor during the workshop implementation. If CRDF Global requests this presentation, the Contractor will be responsible for providing CRDF Global with the finalized presentation ten (10) business days prior to the session at which the Contractor will present. The Contractor may also be responsible for reviewing and editing presentation materials developed by CRDF Global or another party prior to each session.

CRDF Global will facilitate all travel and logistics needs of the in-person workshop.

Task 2 Deliverable(s):

 Presentation materials for a session delivered by the Contractor during the workshop implementation (if required)

Task 3: Communication and Reporting

The Contractor will participate in ad hoc planning calls with CRDF Global to discuss programmatic updates, recent conversations with the Funder, and accommodate shifts in project implementation. CRDF Global and the Contractor will identify a mutually agreed upon day and time for all parties to meet. In addition, the Contractor will attend meetings with interpreters and other vendors as needed.

Following the completion of the three-day workshop, the Contractor will provide an internal Subject Matter Expert Report utilizing a CRDF Global-provided template. The Subject Matter Expert Report will include details, metrics, workshop content (e.g., topics covered), an assessment of knowledge gained by participants, lessons learned, and recommendations for follow-on activities. **This report is due to CRDF Global within ten (10) business days of the activities' completion**. Finally, the Contractor will provide contributions and comments should CRDF Global have questions or need additional information on the activities and Subject Matter Expert Report.

The Contractor will also produce a project Narrative Report, which will be a public-facing readout of the project's activities. The Narrative Report will include details on the workshop content (e.g., topics covered), an assessment of knowledge gained by participants, and context on how the project outcomes factor into broader SDPU program objectives. This report is due to CRDF Global within fifteen (15) business days of the workshop series' completion. Finally, the Contractor will provide contributions and comments should CRDF Global have questions or need additional information on the workshop or reporting.

- Subject Matter Expert Report (internally facing)
- Project Narrative Report (externally facing)
- Consult or advise on projects focused on raising awareness of, and integrating, nuclear science and technology applications into international development efforts in the area of cancer care/control;

Develop conference, workshop, expert session, agendas and other relevant event materials in coordination with international development stakeholders and other technical experts; Lead, support, or moderate conference, workshops, expert sessions or other event sessions with international development stakeholders and other technical



experts; Recommend, arrange, or facilitate meetings or calls with relevant stakeholders, decision-makers, and technical experts; Write, contribute to, advise on, or review reports or articles written independently or jointly with other experts, focused on nuclear science and technology applications in the areas of cancer care/control.

Contractor (SME) Requirements:

CRDF Global is seeking individuals with any or all of the following qualifications:

- Expertise in radiation oncology, nuclear medicine, or medical imaging and diagnosis;
- Experience in developing or contributing to workshop or conference agendas;
- Experience in leading or moderating workshops or conferences;
- Very strong writing abilities/experience in writing clear or persuasive articles or reports focused on the technical area above for policy or development sector audience;
- Understanding the applications of nuclear science and technology in cancer care/control;
- Expertise or experience in working in the technical areas above globally, with particular experience in Africa preferred.

- Statement of Interest and Technical Capabilities

- Cost Proposal
 - Cost Proposal must include a breakdown of hourly rate and number of hours per task referenced Tasks and Deliverables above
 - Cost Proposal must separate out all direct costs (e.g. labor, materials, fees, etc.) as applicable.
 - All travel required for the engagement will be directly handled by CRDF Global. The cost proposal does not need to include travel estimates.
 - For Labor costs, hourly rates and level of effort (in hours) must be provided
 - This is for cost analysis purposes required by federal regulations.
